Brief Intervention and Caregiver Support (BICS) is a unique collaborative program between Calgary Counselling Centre and Calgary and Area Child and Family Services whereby the mental health of children in care is the focus. The aim of the program is to reduce the risk of trauma for the children. Clinicians work closely with caregivers to strengthen and develop caregiving capacity in order to decrease placement breakdown, ensure smoother transitions, and equip caregivers with an understanding of the child's story and developmental needs. The clinician plays an integral role in developing the child's profile and plan of care as well as acting as a member of the child's case team. As a member of a larger clinical team, you will be part of program development and evaluation.

Qualifications:

Candidates must hold a Master's Degree in Social Work and be registered with their College. Preference will be given to individuals with an understanding of the impact of trauma on children and youth, understanding of child/adolescent development, experience supporting families through the provision of practical strategies and tools, a strengths based approach, as well as experience working as part of a multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary team. Familiarity with Children's Services would be an asset. Flexibility with scheduling work hours to meet family's needs as well as a reliable vehicle will be necessary.

Successful candidates will have the following competencies: An ability to work both independently and in a team environment, attention to detail; excellent organizational time management skills; excellent computer skills, ability to think and act systemically; personal flexibility; and excellent communication and report writing skills.
